

Opera in Depth with David Nice, Summer 2025

Wagner's Die Walküre

10 Mondays 2.30-4.30pm starting 28 April 2025

You don't need to have attended the first instalment of our Zoom journey through Wagner's Ring of the Nibelung – videos of Das Rheingold available, all the same, for anyone who didn't – to plunge into the world of passionate human love that is the second of the Ring operas, Die Walküre (The Valkyrie). This great double tragedy interweaves the tragic love of Wotan's mortal son Siegmund for his long-lost sister Sieglinde with the relationship between the chief god and his favourite daughter Brünnhilde. Few can failed to be moved by the musical tenderness and ferocity, culminating in Brünnhilde's rescue of the pregnant Sieglinde and her punishment at the hands of her stricken father.

Barrie Kosky embarks on *Die Walküre* this summer after a thought-provoking production of *Das Rheingold* in the autumn of 2023; the Royal Opera's former Music Director, Antonio Pappano, conducts. Beginning with introductory sessions for context, we will be following the course of the dramas with excerpts from a wide range of recorded performances on CD, DVD and YouTube.
